MULTI-USER LICENSE AGREEMENT FOR THE CHICAGO MANUAL OF STYLE ONLINE WEBSITE

(...)

1. GRANT OF LICENSE. This Agreement grants to the Licensee that its Authorized Users, and only Authorized Users, may access the Product online.

An Authorized Users is:

- (i) Any employee, including faculty, staff, researchers and independent contractors of the Licensee,
- (ii) if the Licensee is an educational institution, any student enrolled at the Licensee,
- (iii) if the Licensee is or includes a library open to patrons not otherwise affiliated with the Licensee, any such patron while on site at the Licensee's facility, using computers or Internet access belonging to the Licensee, and/or
- (iv) any person having lawful access to an Internet Protocol (IP) address registered with the Press for this purpose.

(...)

The Licensee shall not knowingly permit anyone other than Authorized Users to use the Product. The Licensee must promptly take all reasonable steps to terminate any unauthorized access or use of which it has actual notice or knowledge. If such steps are not effective the Licensee must promptly notify the Press and cooperate with the Press in its efforts to terminate the unauthorized conduct.

(...)

The Product is protected by copyright laws and other intellectual property laws throughout the world. Subject to the limited licenses granted herein, the Press and any third party from which the Press has licensed material for inclusion in the Product retain all their respective copyright and other rights in the Product and all portions thereof. Please note: it is illegal to circumvent any copy protection technology employed in the Product. The Licensee may not reverse engineer, decompile, or disassemble the Product, except and only to the extent expressly permitted by applicable law notwithstanding this limitation.
